

1 MS. NEWMAN: In 1997?

2 MR. KAFRISSEN: Well, in '97 -- the
3 surgeries were from '97, I guess, through
4 '99.

6 MS. NEWMAN: But didn't you say at
7 the time of the surgeries?

8 MR. KAFRISSEN: At the time of the
9 surgeries?

10 THE WITNESS: What was the question?

11 BY MR. KAFRISSEN:

12 Q. At the time of the surgery that you performed,
13 are there any books or treatises or journal articles or
14 any types of studies that you would refer to as a
15 physician if you were looking to learn or to find out
16 about the procedures you were performing?

17 A. I still don't understand the question, I'm sorry.

18 MS. NEWMAN: That's your answer, it's
19 fine.

20 BY MR. KAFRISSEN:

21 Q. Okay. As a physician, if you were looking to
22 find out or to learn something about the lasik surgery
23 procedure, are there any standard textbooks which you
24 would refer to find out about the lasik enhancement
procedure?

1 BY MR. KAFRISSEN:

2 Q. Who is that by?

3 A. Leo Bores, B-O-R-E-S.

4 MS. NEWMAN: Again, make sure you're
5 confining it to 1997.

6 THE WITNESS: I'm sure that was out.

7 MS. NEWMAN: If you're not sure, tell
8 him that.

9 THE WITNESS: I'm not positive that
10 one had been published then, but I believe
11 it had.

12 BY MR. KAFRISSEN:

13 Q. Okay. Any others you can think of?

14 A. No.

15 Q. I know we had limited that to the lasik
16 procedure, the last question. And now, with regard to
17 lens extraction or lens replacement surgery same
18 question?

19 A. Much has been written on lens surgery.

20 Q. And what I'm asking about is you, as a physician,
21 is there anything of what has been written that you
22 would refer to as a physician?

23 MS. NEWMAN: In 1998?

24 MR. KAFRISSEN: Right.

1 MS. NEWMAN: In April of 1997 or
2 March of 1997?

3 MR. KAFRISSEN: Right.

4 MS. NEWMAN: The lasik was March of
5 1997.

6 MR. KAFRISSEN: Right.

7 THE WITNESS: Many books, articles,
8 chapters, newspaper articles, magazine
9 articles, have been written on the subject
10 in a wide variety of many different
11 authorities.

12 BY MR. KAFRISSEN:

13 Q. Are there any that you can think of in
14 particular, for instance, you mentioned magazine
15 articles, do you mean professional journals?

16 A. Both.

17 Q. Okay. Are there any that you can think of that
18 you as a physician would look to as opposed to maybe
19 what a layperson might go and look for?

20 A. There are many textbooks.

21 Q. Just for instance what? Throw me some names, if
22 you know of any, if you can think of any names?

23 MS. NEWMAN: If you can.

24 THE WITNESS: Refractive Surgery.

1 THE WITNESS: I can't recall the
2 publication dates of the books I own.

3 BY MR. KAFRISSEN:

4 Q. What are the books you own?

5 A. I don't know that I can give you a list offhand.

6 Q. I don't need all of the names, but just give me
7 some of them that you can recall. We can find out the
8 publication dates and know if they were in existence or
9 if they weren't?

10 A. Well, there's Eye Surgery.

11 Q. Who is that by?

12 A. By George Eisner, E-I-S-N-E-R.

13 Q. Okay.

14 A. That would have been out. I can't think of
15 others that I'm reasonably sure that were published
16 before 1997.

17 Q. Okay. The CV we've marked Nevyas-Wallace 1. Can
18 you describe for me your practice in 1997?

19 A. My practice?

20 Q. Yes.

21 A. What do you want to know about my practice?

22 Q. Tell me what it was, what you were doing, you
23 personally?

24 A. I was taking care of patients, I was operating,
